#### STEEPLE ASHTON PARISH COUNCIL

#### **Response to Wiltshire Local Plan**

At its July meeting the Parish Council received a briefing from Wiltshire Council regarding the forthcoming Local Plan. The Local Plan will affect among other things how and what is built in our Parish in the future. The Parish Council discussed the various means available to our community to influence future development arising from what we understand is the housing allocation – meaning how many new houses the Council thinks ought to be built in Steeple Ashton from now until 2036. Currently that allocation stands at 35 new homes. (Notes of the meeting are available to download from the village website).

The Parish Council has resolved to produce a Neighbourhood Plan for Steeple Ashton Parish. We have chosen this approach as it is the only way to ensure that the wishes of our community form part of planning policy, rather than just being advisory (as is the case with the existing Village Design Statement).

If we do not take this action, the future development of the village will be decided by Wiltshire Council and those landowners willing to sell to developers.

The process will involve asking questions to people in the village (and we need your answers please) and ultimately any plan for the village proposed must be approved by a referendum. It has to take into account all aspects of the community, its housing needs, its heritage and its environment. To oversee the process a Steering Group will be formed, headed up by the Parish Council and including members of the community.

If you would like to join the Steering Group, please contact the Parish Clerk.

We will also shortly hold a public meeting to discuss the proposal further.

## FROM THE ARCHIVES 'Steeple Ashton Newsletter'

#### In August 1977...

From a lengthy article by the newsletter's editor Dennis Hobson – on a July 14 coach trip to London he had enjoyed with around 30 other villagers, arranged by Trowbridge College. His 1,300-word piece was entitled 'To London and the Mother of Parliaments':

last, after various checks, I reached the Strangers' Gallery. From there, me of the Ministers and MPs one sees on TV and reads about in the papers ok on their third dimension. It was rather like a theatre scene, where a

show was being staged which, at Questiontime anyway, was more of a comedy than a drama, particularly in the Prime Minister's fifteen minutes, for some of his replies were worthy of the Morecombe and Wise show. Mr.Callaghan needs of course to put on a show of cheerfulness, in the situation his government is at present in.

Most of the MPs looked sunburnt - evidence of the recent sunny period to which the British have been treated. A conspicuous exception was the face of Enoch Powell: it was pale and set - but with his worries, he must take never to look cheerful. Mr. Heath is portly, white-haired and his face is a

nautical red; but he looked morose. Dr.Owen, our Foreign Secretary, is boyishly handsome. Eric Heffer looked agressive, which he has to be, the warrior wasp defending the Left Wing hive. Mr.William Hamilton surprised me by his genial appearance; he laughed at all the witty repartees and was happy perhaps because the Queen was out of his immediate scrutiny, away in the north-east on her Jubilee tour. Mrs.Thatcher came into the House just before I left. She is fair-haired and was wearing a subdued blue lress. She looked fresh and attractive and not at all as if she gets only the few hours of sleep she claims to need. One would put her down more as an intellectual vicar's wife than the next Prime Minister.

#### HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES

Each Wednesday evening we have been holding games evenings for all school age children on the school field. I think everybody has enjoyed them - it has certainly been fun running them and I would like to thank everybody who has helped. We have played a variety of games - tip and run, rounders, tenniquoit, throwing the frisbee and have had some general practice at throwing and catching. Unfortunately, we were rained off the third week but hope (at the time of writing) that all will be well for the last two evenings. Several parents have also joined in for a good run round the rounders pitch and helped to increase the score of their team.

Also during the holidays, the <u>Book Group</u> has been holding story-reading sessions in various places in the village. These have been quite well attended and I hope several families will come and join in the story picnic on August 31st. It is an hour's break on a Wednesday afternoon when children (and nums) can sit and listen quietly to old favourites orbe introduced perhaps to new stories. Incidentally, the Book Group are having a stall at this year's Country Fayre in Trowbridge, where we will be having a display and running a competition.

This year's sales of books have increased considerably and our activities have broadened. Talks have been given to various Young Wives groups, Town Flaygroup Associations and Mother and Baby groups, where questions and general discussion have shown a real need for readily-available books and a wish for a guide on what to look for in a library. The magazine 'Books for Your Children' received by members as part of their subscription is a help in this.

We have also run a painting competition with book prizes and we look forward to a visit to the Library Resources Centre in September. I hope in the winter months to have more talks and discussions and perhaps a workshop morning for children in the New Year. Membership has increased and widened - we now have forty members, living as far apart as Bradford on Avon and Westbury. We have a regular commitment to read in a near-by school and have a regular reading rota of a dozen members.

#### THE EDINGTON FESTIVAL IS BACK!

After two decidedly different and unusual festivals due to Covid and Covid restrictions, the Edington Music Festival returns on Sunday August 21st for its 67th outing.

The festival will run for its usual eight days — Sunday 21st to Sunday 28th August, with four services a day, three choirs of top-flight singers under three of the country's leading choral directors, all under the direction of a new Festival Director, Robert Quinney, Director of the Choir at New College Oxford (and former Festival Organist and Director of the Nave Choir.)

Robert has themed the music for this special festival under the heading "Creation and Recreation", a nod both to its re-emergence and to its capacity for promoting relaxation and fulfilment.

The week will follow the traditional form starting each day with Matins (plainchant), followed by Eucharist, then Evensong and ending with Compline by candlelight, also plainchant. Wednesday 24th will be both the return of the BBC recording, (to be broadcast at a later date), and the Festival Supper in the evening; the Friday evening service will be a Requiem Mass (by Michael Haydn, younger brother of Joseph), and the week will also include Vaughan Williams' 'Mass in G Minor', Copland's 'In the beginning', and Dove's 'Seek him that maketh the Seven Stars'.

#### Dear All,

Living much of my youth only fifty or so miles by road north of the Border, I had the opportunity regularly to head south to Northumberland to discover the riches of this relatively unknown part of England. Not so long ago I fell into conversation with a parishioner who told me how he and his wife had hugely enjoyed discovering this great county. We shared impressions of the castle ruins at Dunstanburgh and Warkworth, of the splendid coastline, and of memories of the puffins and seals on the Farne Islands. We spoke too about the tidal island of Lindisfarne with its castle perched on a rock above the lime kilns on the shore, and remodelled early last century as a habitable and very romantic dwelling by Lutyens. Also known as Holy Island, this magical place, with the remains of its priory and strong association with St Aidan and St Cuthbert, is a popular place of pilgrimage.

The name of Cuthbert often eclipses that of Aidan, but it is appropriate that in these days of late summer we should focus on Aidan whose Christian witness we mark in the Church calendar on 31st August.

Of Aidan's early life, nothing is known, except that his origins were Irish. He came to England in 635, sent from the monastic community at Iona by King Oswald who had been exiled to that place, and who now, having regained the throne of Northumbria from Mercian invaders, wanted to do what he could to convert his people to Christianity. That same year Aidan was consecrated Bishop of Lindisfarne, which was well suited as a base for evangelising Bernicia, the northern part of Northumbria where Oswald's power was concentrated. He worked closely with Oswald, who, in the early days, acted as his interpreter; and he became involved in the training of priests. Aidan developed a reputation for discretion and prudence, and with the popular support that he won, he strengthened the Church beyond the boundaries of Northumbria.

Aidan founded churches and monasteries, liberated Anglo-Saxon slave-boys, and encouraged monastic practices amongst the laity, including fasting and meditation on the Scriptures. Much of what we know about Aidan's life comes from the writings of the Venerable Bede, who showed perhaps greater affection for him than he did for any other saint. He praised him eloquently for his love of prayer, study, peace, purity and humility, as well as for his care of the sick and the poor. Living a life of poverty and detachment himself, Aidan was able to reprove the powerful and wealthy.

Aidan died at Bamburgh, a short distance from Lindisfarne, in 651. Some of his bones were laid to rest ultimately in the parish church which is the only ancient church in England dedicated to him; his remaining bones were returned to Ireland.

Sam and Jill talked about the fact that little was known about the disease, and that as a result there was so little funding for its Association compared with other national charities. Shortly before Jill died, Sam promised her that she would do something about this.

Inspiration came from a Dinner Dance put on as long ago as 1974, by Guy and the Village Hall Entertainments Committee, to provide the remaining funds to rebuild the Village Hall, which was then a pretty basic corrugated iron structure.

The event was held in a hangar on the airfield, with Kenny Ball and his Jazzmen (who required a case of vodka, which they consumed during the evening, as part of their fee) and attracted 3,500 people.

#### The Motor Neurone Disease Association

This charity pays for accommodation and help with travel and food costs for parents so that they can get some rest and reduce their financial worries at such a stressful time in their lives.

Wiltshire Air Ambulance is well known to you all, I'm sure but what you may not know, is that it is entirely dependent on charity to continue its vital, life-saving work.














#### Jubilee Football Tournament - 3rd June






#### St Mary's Church Organ Pipes – Restoration of the original decoration

#### **Helen writes:**

When the organ was restored in 2008/11, by the St Mary's Preservation Trust (the Trust), it was noted by the Diocesan Advisory Council (DAC) that it would be good if the organ pipes could be restored but they understood that there was not the money available to do this. The main restoration had cost £62,000. This project was masterminded for the Trust by the late Declan Walton and he was very keen to see the pipes restored to their original Victorian decoration. In his memory, his widow Jeannette has recently offered a donation to the Trust specifically to help carry out this work. The Trust has agreed to support the project and in view of her age, we all would like to see it completed as soon as possible.




Black and white photo of the organ and its pipes with their original decoration. David Little, on behalf of the donor and the PCC, has been working to carry out her wishes. He asked me to assist him as I am a member of the Trust committee, and we have been seeking specialist help for the past few months. We found Robert Woodland from Robert Woodland & Son of London who has just completed the re-decoration of the pipes in York Minster. He has an amazing record of work on painting organ pipes — on over 28 organs — and has worked over the years in many important buildings including the Houses of Parliament, Buckingham Palace, no 10 Downing Street and many of the London Livery Halls. He is a liveryman of the Painter Stainers' of London and has City & Guilds qualifications.

The pipes in St Mary's are currently painted silver and this was applied in 1956 when the original paint on the pipes was said to be in a poor condition. There is a black and white photograph, taken at this time probably by Peter Yerborough, which gives some idea of the painted decoration on the pipes. This would have been colourful and probably included some gilding. It is still possible to see the outlines of the painted shapes on the pipes, through the silver coating, which is useful.

Robert came to Steeple Ashton back in March and was totally impressed with our church and its historic organ but was distressed to see the silver paint which was hiding its decoration. He would be very happy to come and work on our pipes to restore them to their original colours, patterns and gilding. Initially, he would test two or three of the pipes to discover the best way to remove the silver paint and to establish the colours and pigments used by the original painters. The designs can be traced and hand cut stencils produced to re-paint the original designs. Robert is known internationally for his skills in this field and at the present time, we have found no one else with his qualifications and expertise.

The DAC have been consulted to determine if a Faculty is needed for this restoration work. The organ is normally considered as 'furniture' and is not part of the fabric of the building. It seems that we may not need this to carry out test work but would need permission to carry out the complete restoration. The PCC and our vicar would need to commission the work to be carried out and paid for by the Trust – the PCC does not have the funds

to do this restoration. The church architect has also been involved and the organist and the vicar has asked two specialist paint conservators to inspect and test the pipes to determine colours and pigments. This would obviously incur extra costs and neither of these specialists have actually worked on the re-painting of organ pipes. We have tried to involve as many people as possible in the search for information.

I felt that as this newsletter reaches so many local people, you also ought to know what is happening. The church clock restoration, funded by the Trust, was a great success and is now admired by everyone. Hopefully, the same can be said of the organ after its restoration.
