2022.118	Planning Applications PL/2023/01767 - 32 ACRESHORT LANE, STEEPLE ASHTON, TROWBRIDGE, BA14 6HD - This is a householder application for internal alterations and proposed first floor extension and garage conversion to the existing dwelling at 32 Acre Short Lane, Steeple Ashton. The proposal additionally includes a new oak double garage - Objection on the grounds that the proposed development would have a detrimental impact on the character and appearance of the area, due to the visual impact of the

<p>2022.119</p>	<p>Neighbourhood Plan – Village Survey</p> <p>Members noted the receipt of the analysis into the recent village survey from the PC’s planning consultants (copy previously circulated) and considered how to deal with those issues which were not strictly Neighbourhood Plan related. The Chair had sent an email outlining the issues which could be considered by the PC:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vehicle speed and numbers through the village. • Drainage / flooding. • Footpaths & pavements. • Sustainable Travel Plan. • Community Facilities. • Better facilities and activities for young families. • Improvements to Play areas (REC Group tasked with this). • Green environment. • Carbon reduction. <p>Members discussed the issues above and it was agreed that it would be useful to set up an informal working group to explore traffic related issues. Cllr Tapper would take this forward as lead member, in conjunction with his CSW role. This would be publicised in the next newsletter.</p> <p>The Chair would contact Cllr Seed in relation to drainage and flooding issues, further to the PC’s previous correspondence on this matter.</p> <p>The Council would consider the other items for prioritisation at the Annual Council Meeting in May.</p>
<p>2022.120</p>	<p>St Mary’s Playing Field</p> <p>Members considered a request from the St Marys & Newleaze Recreation Working Group for permission for additional planting at St Mary’s – a report from the Chair had been previously circulated and was introduced. Hedge planting was requested from the entrance gate to Sandpits Lane and back down from Bartlett’s Mead towards the kick wall. The planting was approved.</p>
