PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Exercise of Public Rights to Inspect the 2022/2023 Accounts

Steeple Ashton Parish Council confirms the dates set for the period for the exercise of public rights are as follows:

Commencing on Monday 12th June 2023 and ending on Friday 21st July 2023

Any person interested has got the right to inspect and make copies of the accounts to be audited and all books, deeds, contracts, bills, vouchers and receipts relating to them. For the year ended 31st March 2023 these documents will be available on reasonable notice on application to the Clerk.

The period of inspection is 30 working days. This year it commences 12th June and ends 21st July.

The internal audit report and other relevant documents 2022-2023 are available for inspection. The paperwork has now been sent to the external auditor PKF Littlejohn LLP 1 Westferry Circus London E14 4HD. The external auditor's report will be published when completed.

Parish Council Vacancies

New members can be co-opted to the council through a simple vote, there is no need to go through an election process. You do need to be over 18 years old and have lived or worked in the parish for the past 12 months.

The Parish Council would like to form a Highways group within the village of Steeple Ashton. The group would consult and consider matters relating to the highways through the village in particular to road safety to all road users including pedestrians.

WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR NEWS FROM JONATHON SEED

The summer continues with long and hot days producing their fair share of issues for Councils of all types. However Wiltshire Council can finally try to catch up with the never ending list of potholes that require repairing after a "perfect pothole storm" of a winter which was both wet and cold. The numbers of repairs and the quality of those repairs are improving. A 10% weekly gain on repairs over reports is really good news and new machines are making a better job of those repairs. I repeat the mantra that if it is not reported then it will not get repaired so please keep using the MYWILTS app to report potholes. It is of note that Wiltshire Council ran a very well attended Pothole webinar in June to update residents on the work that the Council is doing in this area and it is hoped that this very informative event will be repeated.

Transport and highways remain really important parts of our lives in our rural County where we rely so heavily on our cars to get about. However not everyone has a car so it is good news that the £2 bus fare was extended by Wiltshire Council. The Council is also looking to improve cycling and walking routes in our local towns. The three Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plans (LCWIPs) set out proposals for cycling and walking networks in each town(Trowbridge, Devizes and Chippenham), and highlight how these networks will be improved and connected to make it easier and safer to walk and cycle in the towns. Have a look on the Wiltshire Council website in order to have your say on these Plans.

Wiltshire Council is also trying to modernise its Waste Collection and Recycling services. Every household should have had a leaflet to explain what is happening and this is worth a read. It is particularly important to comply with what you can and cannot put in various bins as the Council is checking bin content on a random basis before they are collected (a practice which I have opposed). However one new and useful service is that the Council will collect small rechargeable electrical items if you put them in a carrier bag and leave the bag next to your blue bin on collection day.

Finally, on a personal note, I am pleased to have been elected by fellow Melksham Wiltshire Councillors to Chair the Melksham Area Board once more. I have chaired the Board for eight of the past fourteen years and I am looking forward to a term of office where I can concentrate on services and serving within our Community Area.

A hand can protect and give comfort. A hand can create and direct. There is a sculpture made by the Swedish artist Carl Milles called 'The hand of God', and it gives a beautiful image of what it can be to be in God's hand. The sculpture is a big hand lifted up, toward the sky. In the palm of the hand a man is standing on his two feet, and it looks like he is finding his balance in the hand while he is also, at the same time, stretching himself to see maybe the world, his surroundings, what the future holds. That is one way to be in God's hand; to stand up, meet life and the future, while finding balance and strength in the palm of God's hand.

God is near to all of us. Sometimes we might sense it as a protective or comforting hand when we somehow feel that we are not alone. We might pray that God's loving hand will be there to direct us into a path that is right for us. We might every now and then see traces of God's creative hand when we discover grace in the nature around us. We can also remind ourselves how the source for strength and balance can be in God's hand.

I like to think of it as a hand opened up to bless us. God is near and we can stand up in God's hand, open to God's blessings when we meet the world and our future.

The film has a running time of **95 minutes** and will start at **7.30 pm.**

Film critic, Nick Riganas, writes about 12 Angry Men as follows:

"In need of a unanimous, cut-and-dried guilty verdict by the end of the session, twelve jurors crammed in a small New York City jury room during one scorching hot day have the fate of an impecunious eighteen-year-old man in their hands. However, in what seems like an open-and-shut case of first-degree murder, one man, Juror #8, harbours reasonable doubt about the young defendant's guilt, having a hunch that there is a lot more to it than meets the eye. After all, a man is innocent until proven guilty. Can concerned Juror #8 overcome the obstinate prejudices of the other eleven members of the jury and let truth shine?"

The following Friday, **8th December**, we will be holding our Candlelit Supper as we did last year. Sandie is already planning the decorations!!


There are also plans afoot to have an American Brunch on Saturday **3rd February** something to cheer us all in one of the gloomiest months! Details in due course.



But most of all I'd like to thank our village residents for welcoming all of the visitors and supporting the school in such a huge way."

In other news this month, local children attending Keevil School welcomed the Wiltshire Air Ambulance for an Emergency Awareness Training programme.

The school children were put through their paces with an interactive training session delivering a range of lifesaving skills including:

- How to phone for an ambulance
- How to perform CPR
- Placing a patient in the recovery position
- Operation of an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED)
- Assisting a person who is choking

The Wiltshire Air Ambulance aim is to educate the community and provide the children with the knowledge to confidently manage a medical emergency prior to the arrival of an Ambulance.

Head Teacher Linsey Hermon said "The course is a wonderful opportunity for our pupils to become even more well rounded individuals. Not only was it a great learning experience for all of the children, it arms them with new skills and knowledge that could make a real difference if they experience a medical emergency at home or in the community."

LUFFENHAM FIELD.....Could be lost to the village!

The lease for Luffenham field was held by the Friends of Steeple Ashton and all the brilliant work that has gone on there has been done under their stewardship. Now that the Friends of Steeple Ashton have disbanded, the lease has been returned to the trustees of the field.

At this stage no other group has come forward to take it on, and as a result the field will either be returned to its natural state, or a farmer will take on the lease and put it to crops or for grazing animals.....either way, it WON'T be available to be used by the village anymore.

Access will be restricted to the main footpath across the middle only (as with all private land)

The walks around the field will not be available

The benches and seats will go

Families will not be able to use it for nature walks

The Parish Council has intimated that they would consider taking on the lease and the insurance for the field, to allow it to remain a village amenity, as long as a group of people take on the maintenance (currently one villager maintains it, and could do with a little help).

So.....if you value this facility and can give an hour or so a month to help with trimming, cutting back and general maintenance of the footpaths, then please let Nicola Duke, Clerk of Steeple Ashton Parish Council know, so that the PC can make a decision.



Edington Music Festival
