SITE ASSESSMENTS

At the start of this process, a 'call for sites' was sent out asking people to put forward pieces of land that could potentially be built on. We received more than 20 sites and the initial assessment on suitability has been undertaken.

We are now at a stage to share this information with you all as part of the public consultation process.

We plan to have a 'drop in' event in the village hall in January for those that can attend, and also plan to have all the information available elsewhere during January for those to peruse at leisure. Dates and locations for the consultation will be published in the December's magazine, and on Facebook.

This is an opportunity for you to have your input on sites that could be built on; please come along and have your say.

Jonathon Seed writes

The Wiltshire Council year marches on and Councillors have just attended the October meeting of the Council. It was a full agenda with many issues from climate change to local parish boundary reviews being discussed. This was in addition to regular Council business including representations from members of the public, budget monitoring and Committee reports to the Council. Also agreed at Council meetings are appointments and changes to Committee posts and I am pleased to have been appointed as a member of the Overview and Scrutiny Management Committee of Wiltshire Council. This may seem a bit local government "tech" but this is the Committee which scrutinises the Executive as well as assisting with policy development. I have lengthy experience of this work and recently Chaired a policy development task group to recommend much needed change to the policy of Council housing allocations.

From the present to the past last month we held a highly successful Melksham Area Board. I took over the Chair of this Board in June and have moved to themed meetings to try and reignite public interest in the work of our local Area Board. Last month we chose heritage as our theme and met in Melksham. The meeting started with a heritage walk of Melksham town conducted by Melksham Historical Society. This was hugely interesting but best of all 50 residents turned out in the drizzle to learn more about the town of Melksham. The meeting itself was attended by a separate and similar number of residents who received information on all sorts of heritage aspects and generated a desire to see Melksham included in the new County heritage App. The next Area Board is on Wednesday 6th December at 7pm in Semington Village Hall when the theme will be local highways including local highways issues, of roads, footpaths and cycleways. This meeting is open to the public so please come along.

The past month has also seen quite a heavy caseload of local concerns. These include alleged illegal expansion of a local travellers site, potential housing development in a village, worries about traffic increase in Great Hinton, concern at maintenance of the local WW2 pill box defences in Semington, a move to upgrade a village playing field into the village community activity area in Steeple Ashton and many others. Each of the issues noted, and many others, bring their own need for local government liaison and trying to make a difference and address people's concerns is the best part of my role as your Wiltshire Councillor.

THE STEEPLE ASHTON SCHOOL BUILDING

The Village Community Shop, and The Guild of Spinners, Weavers and Dyers

The old school building that houses the Village Community Shop, and the Guild of Spinners, Weavers and Dyers, is managed by the St. Mary's SBMC (School Building Management Committee).

Since at least 1846, the building has been given in trust to the local community by the Long Family. It was originally managed by the St Mary's School Board and Diocese, followed by Wiltshire County Council. When the school closed in 2004, the SBMC was formed to ensure that it was occupied by appropriate tenants, that suitable leases were agreed, and that reasonable service charges were levied to enable the maintenance of the building and ensure its continued use by the local community (and with the educational requirement of the trust deed currently being fulfilled by the Guild and the Village Shop).

From 2005 to 2023, maintenance of the building has been carried out on a rolling annual programme, and has included some substantial projects such as the renovation of the front iron railings and Bath Stone wall, which was financially supported in part by both the Parish Council and Wiltshire Council.

However, during the past couple of years, it has become clear that much more work is required, especially regarding energy efficiency. The Committee is looking at a range of improvements, including:

- o Replacement of the windows
- o Solar panels on the back roof (to produce electricity primarily for the shop)
- o Structural work on the portakabins, (to maintain them and give the Guild security of tenure in those buildings.)

All of these projects require substantial funding so a Fund-Raising Group has been established to look at how this could be achieved.

Reflection - The coins in your pocket

We don't need reminding that life is all about choices. We are constantly in situations where we can do one thing or another, or when shopping, buy something in preference to something else.

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus is presented with a choice. He is shown a coin and asked if it is lawful to pay taxes to the emperor. He replies – 'Give to the emperor what is the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's.

On first reading, this story is about separating the secular world – especially money – from the spiritual world. But this is too simple, and not how Matthew would have wished his Gospel to be read for it is full of Jesus meeting ordinary people in everyday situations and tackling the religious authorities on practical matters of faith. If the world and everything in it belongs to God, by giving to the authorities of the world what is due to them, we are ultimately giving to God.

Jesus is highlighting that we come to church primarily to worship God. We don't bring such worldly disputes as Jesus was presented with unless we intend to pray about them. Nor do we bring to church debates about the coins in our pockets, although our church has to pay its bills in our country's currency, and with our responsibilities to the wider world, we use that currency to help those in need. What we bring to church is ourselves, however spiritually rich or poor we may be. We are chosen and loved by God who has given everything uniquely to us, and as we come to church, we offer it all back to God.





NATURAL HISTORY CLUB

In early October there were still Swallows taking advantage of the weather and fattening themselves up before migration to South Africa. Normally they would all be gone as their food source runs out. Now that our summer visiting birds have departed, look out for our winter visitors arriving. Redwing and Fieldfare from Scandinavia and Northern Europe who come to enjoy the milder winters. Listen out on a still night for the high pitched zeeer calls of the Redwing migrating overhead. They do migrate at night. Also look out for our sedentary finches such as Chaffinch and Linnets that flock together over farmland, especially into fields left to stubble where they take advantage of the spilled grain. You may even spot a few of their European cousins, the Brambling, amongst them. These are slightly smaller than Chaffinch and migrate here in the winter. If you're lucky you might catch the sight of Lapwing or Golden Plover, waders that migrate south from Northern England and Scotland.

Fairly large flocks of 200 or more Golden Plover have been seen in the fields surrounding the village.

It has been reported by many that they are seeing more Hares this year than previously. It has been suggested that the Badger cull in Wiltshire last year could be responsible. Who knew that Badgers predated Leverets? Could this also be the reason Hedgehog numbers are up as well? Anyone else noticed a lack of wasps / hornets this summer?

It was noted by a member, who has Hedgehogs in her garden, that one or two reappeared with white markings on them. This usually happens when they have been 'rescued' and returned to the area where they were rescued. Do we have someone rehabilitating hedgehogs in the village? Please let us know.

Here's a thought:

It's time to clean out and re-site your nest boxes. After the end of each breeding season, ideally September or October, all nest boxes should be taken down, old nesting materials removed, and the box should be scalded with boiling water to kill any parasites. Do not use insecticides, flea-powders or soap. These can be harmful to birds. Boiling water is adequate.

Under the terms of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, if unhatched eggs are found in the box, they can only legally be removed from October to January inclusive, and they must be destroyed – it is illegal to keep them.

Re-site the box, Ideally facing North East. You can place dry hay or wood shavings in it as they might be used as a warm roost through cold winter months.

Report from St Mary's PCC

The PCC met on 12th October under the chairmanship of David Little as the vicar was absent on sick leave.

The secretary was asked to send a get well message to Fr Oliver.

Items discussed included the following:

Faculty for the restoration of the Organ Pipes

David Little confirmed the receipt of this document and read out the recommendations made by the DAC. These include the use of Robert Woodland as our specialist which is very helpful. Helen Montague-Smith reported that she had recently spoken to Robert and he is taking a break from a very large job working on the pipes in Leeds Town Hall. He expects to return there in the early spring to complete the job. He is very keen to work on the pipes here and we hope that he will be able to work on our pipes in late spring next year.

Robert Woodland & Sons sent a revised estimate of costs for the work – the prices of most things including gold, have gone up in the year since his previous estimate. This will be forwarded to the Preservation Trust for their information.

It was again emphasised that the PCC does not have enough information about what is happening in our church during the vicar's sick leave and the fact that he is unavailable to carry out the many tasks he said he would as listed in the previous minutes.

We do know that Tony Longdon, as usual, will be taking the Remembrance Service on 12th November which is good news as this service is always very well attended. The Rural Dean, Jane Palmer, will be finding other ministers to cover for the services which are scheduled during November.

It was noted that the Rec group would like to put up information about St Mary's field on a notice board in the church.

The PCC will meet again on 14th November.


