#### **GH Parish Council meeting dates 2024**

The Parish council will meet on the following dates, at 7pm, in the Great Hinton Memorial Hall:

#### **GH Parish Council Budget and Precept 2024-2025**

At the January PC meeting the members considered and agreed the precept for the coming fiscal year. This has been set at £3,243.55 for the year which is a 3% increase equating to £30.80 per band D property.

#### **GH Planning Applications**

The Parish Council considered the below applications ahead of the March meeting:

**PL/2024/01097** – 6 Littleton, Semington, Trowbridge, BA14 6LG – Proposed demolition of existing attached double garage and enclosed car port and erecting single storey front extension with two storey side extension – No Objection

**PL/2024/01145** – FORE ST FARM, 23 Great Hinton, Trowbridge, BA14 6BX – Conversion of existing linked barns to a single dwelling unit; the provision of a car port; associated works – No Objection subject to Highways Conditions being met.

#### **GH Parish Matters – Traffic Update**

We are really pleased to report that our Highways Improvement Request for 'road narrows 'with a supplementary sign saying, 'single track road for 1 mile', to be placed at the location of the MOD signs at each end of the village, has been approved by Melksham Local Highway and Footway Improvement Group. There will be new poles and MOD signs as well.

We will also have two portable signs saying, 'single track road unsuitable for diverted traffic,' with sandbags to weight them, to be used at each end of the village when there are problems arising from a road closure. The method of deploying these will be decided by the Parish Council.

Regarding the Traffic Survey Request from a parishioner, our Parish Clerk, Naomi Mildenhall, responding to contact from Wiltshire Council has heard that the original choice of location (outside the Village Hall) is not ideal for installation purposes, and they have given a location outside Barn Cottage. We have been informed by Highways that we are more likely to qualify for a 20mph limit, if the results show 24/25mph or lower, so we hope the survey will show that traffic is driving slowly at that location.

Jonathon Seed was very active in ensuring that members of the LHFIG were well briefed on the importance of our requests so Mike Sankey Chair of LHFIG was able to give more support to looking at the speed limits at the ends of the village, and the facilitating of the repair of some of the damage to roads and verges by the inappropriate diversion on 5th January. Keevil Parish Council were also able to support us by submitting the request for the signs at the Strand end of the village.

We would like to thank all those who attended the PC meeting on 11th January, and to those villagers who have campaigned so enthusiastically to support us in our endeavours to create a safer village for us all. The traffic survey is only the first step, so your continued support will be most welcome.

#### WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR NEWS FROM JONATHON SEED

March was a month of ups and downs both personally and locally. I pen this month's news from a hospital bed having had an accident which resulted in a fractured pelvis. I will mend but the experience of a short spell in hospital has reminded me, in spite of demonstrable problems, just how lucky we are to have our National Health Service. This time also reminds me what a debt we owe to those that staff the NHS 24/7 giving superb nursing care and often carrying out critical but less than palatable personal care tasks.

Modern technology means that I have been able to keep up with local issues and the workings of local government in Wiltshire. The majority of the Parish Councils in this area are held in the first half of the month as was the Melksham Area Board, which I chair, so I was able to attend these important local meetings in person. I also attended my first meeting as a member of the Strategic Planning Committee and it was satisfying to vote on the long standing injustice of developers forcing unwanted housing developments in local areas and particularly one in my Council Division.

I have recently been elected by fellow councillors to chair an influential task group to examine how Wiltshire Council sets and assesses the criteria for local speed limits. This appointment comes to me as a senior back bencher and allows me to use my experience to influence important policy change in Wiltshire. All these meetings take place remotely and I look forward to reporting our findings and recommendations in June, and hopefully seeing them actioned later this year.

At the end of the financial year I can look back at the local grant funding that has been achieved for local communities. There have been several successful bids for area board funding, including for football equipment in Steeple Ashton, heritage assets in Great Hinton and for air conditioning in Berryfield Village Hall. We now look forward to the next financial year and the opening of bids for funding of community projects in the forthcoming year. If there is a project in your village that needs funding then please work up a bid and I will help. We either use the community funding or lose it.

#### Neighbourhood Plan Update

Thanks to all those who replied to the recent consultation on housing sites in the village; in total we received 269 responses, 186 online and 83 as paper forms. Our consultant will be processing the data and further ranking it against the objectives of the plan before making their recommendations at the May meeting of the Steering Group.

In the meantime, the members of the Steering Group are preparing supporting papers on topics such as village heritage, character, green spaces and key views. These all go towards making up the evidence base behind the final plan.

The next big step is to commission a strategic environmental assessment, once we have a shortlist of sites. This is likely to take 6 to 9 months to complete, meaning that the public referendum on the final plan will not take place until late 2025.

Members of the Steering Group will be in attendance at the Annual Parish Meeting on 24th April should you wish to discuss with them progress with the plan.

In the meantime please contact the parish clerk if you have any specific queries in relation to the neighbourhood plan.

#### NATURAL HISTORY CLUB

#### **News**

Our last meeting in March saw a talk and picture show presented by David Culverhouse on the wildlife of The Gambia, especially the birds. It was very interesting especially when you contrast the species with the UK. For a country half the size of Wales it has twice as many species. For example we have one species of Kingfisher, The Gambia on the other hand, has eight! Amongst other birds such as Nightjars, we were shown pictures of Hooded vultures, Sacred Ibis and Great White Egrets. Plenty of Black Kites amongst the 100 species of Raptors, but no Red Kites, in contrast to UK.

Nearer home, members have reported seeing birds in their gardens that wouldn't normally come in such as Yellowhammers and Reed Bunting . Red Kites are ever increasing in numbers and reported on a daily basis. Not so long ago they were a rare sight in this area. Siskins have been seen on feeders.

Hedgehog feeding brings other issues. It would appear many of our hedgehogs, probably due to the mild weather, haven't bothered hibernating. Feeding them, according to members, has attracted unwanted visitors such as Rats. It would appear from reports that Rats in people's gardens has been a big talking point this winter.

You're all probably aware of Starling murmurations as these iridescent birds gather at dusk to roost. Well we have had our own mini version over the fields at the back of Bartletts Mead. Presumably roosting in the trees down Butts lane.


We hope to start having local outings such as a nature walk and foraging walk locally.

#### Reflection from this year's World Day of Prayer

Put peace into each other's hands And like a treasure hold it.

Put peace into each other's hands. Put **peace** – it requires action, Lord. **Prayerful action**.

Not just **hoping** for something, **yearning** for something, even **praying** for something, but **actively doing something.** 

And, put peace into each other's hand, Lord?

But what about **my viewpoint and opinion**? Because to put something into someone else's hands means giving it away, not holding onto what is mine, letting go.

It might be a bit easier if I knew I would be giving it to those I know and love, those I trust. But what about the 'other'? Those who are different to me? Those I don't agree with? Those I'm not sure I can trust?

My thoughts, viewpoint, hopes and prayers – given away.

And as I stand, momentarily empty-handed, how do I feel? There is a vulnerability in giving, offering peace.

Will it be rebuffed? Mocked? Or accepted? Welcomed?

Put peace into each other's hands

And like a treasure hold it.

Like a treasure hold it. A reminder, Lord, that this is something precious, this gift of peace we give each other.

Having given, can I now recognise its worth? Can I treasure it? Indeed, can I even accept it?





#### A FOOTNOTE ON THOMAS SEYMOUR

May I, on behalf of everyone in the village, say a huge thank you to Bryan Berrett, (no doubt with help from David), for the continuing series of articles on the local history of this area. As someone who is a volunteer Room Guide at Lacock Abbey, I would just like to add a postscript to the recent articles about Thomas Seymour, whom many of you may not realise had close connections to Lacock Abbey. The Abbey was founded almost 800 years ago in 1232 and has a long rich history . Three hundred years as an abbey until 1539 when good old Henry VIII closed it down during the Dissolution of the Monasteries. Then followed almost 500 years as a family home.

Bryan mentioned that Seymour entered crooked dealings with the Vice Treasurer of Bristol Mint. That man was the owner of Lacock Abbey, Sir William Sharrington. Sharrington had bought Lacock in 1540 from Henry VIII. He paid only £783 to buy the Abbey, the village of Lacock and all the surrounding land. As a crony of Henry, I suspect he got a discount! Like many people in power, Sharrington was a bit of a rogue. He became the Vice Treasurer of the Mint in 1547. This was one of the few outside of London that was licensed to mint Gold coins. Sharrington soon started to produce counterfeit coins and falsify records stashing away a fortune.

Seymour needed money to fund a private army to wrest power from his brother Edward. He had become Lord Protector, effectively ruling the country as Regent for the young King Edward VI, who had succeeded Henry VIII on his death in 1547 at the age of only 9. Sharrington supported Seymour in his quest for an armed insurrection using his ill gotten gains from the Mint. Eventually both Seymour and Sharrington were accused of Treason and locked in the Tower of London. Sharrington had been arrested In the Strong Room at Lacock Abbey. The misuse of the funds was only one of 33 charges eventually laid against Thomas Seymour. Sharrington pleaded 'not me Gov' and was eventually given a pardon although he still had to pay £12000 to get out of Jail and subsequently reclaim his many properties, which included Lacock. These had been confiscated on his arrest. Poor old Thomas Seymour was found guilty and beheaded in March 1549. Sharrington returned to Lacock, was reelected as an MP in 1551 and became the Sheriff of Wiltshire in 1552. But he died only a year later in 1553 at the age of 58. Edward Seymour had also by then, fallen from power, and had been beheaded in 1552. King Edward VI only lived until 1553 when he died of TB at the age of 15. Lady Jane Grey and then Mary succeeded Edward over the next 5 years until 1558 when Henry VIII's daughter

Elizabeth from his marriage with Anne Boleyn became Queen ruling until 1603.

Sharrington's descendants lived at the Abbey for almost 500 years. In 1944 the Abbey was gifted to the National Trust, but the family continued to live there until 2011, only 13 years ago.

The Abbey's many layers of history include, the possession of one of the four surviving copies of the 1225 Magna Carta, held from 1232 until 1944 and is now on display in the British Library; occupation by the Parliamentarians during the English Civil War in 1645; and the invention of photography by William Fox Talbot in 1835. Indeed the Abbey is now classified as one of the 'Treasure Houses' of the National Trust because of the significance of Fox Talbot's invention.

Almost 200,000 visitors came to the Abbey last year, although ironically some of them came because of the link with the Harry Potter films rather than the history of the place! Many of the Hogwarts scenes were filmed in the Cloisters at Lacock. Is it a coincidence that the Postmaster at Lacock Post Office from 1927 until 1966 was also called Harry Potter? Over recent years, both the Abbey and the village have been used as backdrops in many films and TV series.

The National Trust is now starting to plan for the 800th anniversary of the Abbey in 2032. Another chapter in its long history! **Ken Hunt** 



Edward Seymour, 1st Duke of Somerset & Lord Protector of the Realm from 1547 to 1550

#### Bryan writes...

#### The final word on the Seymour Brothers, Thomas & Edward

Last month, we left off where the estate of Steeple Ashton was returned to the crown following the execution of Thomas Seymour in March 1549. He had owned the estate for 10 years. Thomas's downfall had come about as a result of his persistent attempts to undermine his brother Edward – Duke of Somerset, Lord Protector and guardian of the young King Edward VI.

Thomas was charged with 33 acts of treason – and Edward's signature headed the list of names on the death warrant which sealed his fate.

What follows this month is the final act in the Seymour brothers' saga:

Freed from the devious schemes of his brother, Edward Seymour now seemed more secure in his lofty position at the head of government, and in Tudor high society. However, as events played out, this was not to be the case.

Six months after Thomas's execution, Edward began to learn that his leadership was under threat. The other members of the Regency Council had become united in their view that his handling of the political and religious unrest in England during 1548 and 1549, and his preoccupation with war with Scotland, had caused a colossal failure of government.

By 1 October 1549, fearing the worst, Edward issued a proclamation calling for assistance — and fled with the young King Edward VI to the safety of Windsor Castle. One week later he wrote to the Lord Mayor of London, requesting 1000 troops to defend himself and the king; but the mayor had already attended a meeting that moved against the Protector.


Edward Seymour was arrested on 11 October 1549. He faced various charges issued by the Regency Council, amounting to mismanagement of government. He was held in the Tower of London, but then released early in 1550 and restored to the council. In February 1550, a new leader of the council emerged: John Dudley, the Earl of Warwick – who became Lord Protector.

By mid-October 1551 Edward was back in the Tower on exaggerated charges of treason and felony. He was accused of attempting to effect a change of government by working to overthrow his successor, John Dudley, and inciting Londoners into rebellion. Tried at Westminster Hall on 1 December, Edward was acquitted of treason, but found guilty of felony – and sentenced to death.

On the morning of 22 January 1552, in defiance of government orders to stay at home, a large crowd gathered on Tower Hill. They had come to watch Edward Seymour face the same fate as he had condemned his brother to three years earlier.

Having knelt in the straw to pray, Edward handed some gold sovereigns to his executioner. He then removed his gown, knelt, and placed his neck on the block. The executioner turned down his collar, and gave him a handkerchief to cover his eyes. He then asked him to stand and remove his waistcoat. After placing his neck again, Edward began praying "O Lord Jesus preserve me" three times – with the axe falling partway through his third utterance of "Jesus".

Within the British Library, there is a small almanac measuring just  $3^{3/4}$  inches x 3 inches. On its fly-leaf are the following words – penned by Edward Seymour in the Tower of London, the day before his execution:



Fere of the lord is the bgenning of wisdume

Put thi trust in the lord wt all thine hart

Be not wise in thyne owne conseyte but fere the lord and fle frome euele

frome the toware

the day before my deth

1551

Edward had secretly kept the almanac on his person when taken to the Tower, and was quoting verses from a 1535 translation of the Bible. By dating it 1551 he was using the calendar of his time, when the civil new year began on Lady Day -25 March. For clarity, his words read:

Fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom

Put thy trust in the Lord with all thine heart

Be not wise in thine own conceit but fear the Lord and flee from evil

The sessions are completely free of charge. Please contact the school office if you would like to register your interest.


