This lodge gate still stands, a reminder of the Victorian Gothic 46-bedroomed mansion – ancestral home of the Long family – that lay beyond. In May 1975, with the wrecking ball having swung into action at the stripped-out roofless shell the mansion had become, an eleventh-hour spot listing by the Department of the Environment stopped total demolition. Today, what was saved – the former servants' wing – is a substantial country house, overlooking the original parkland.

Rural Policing Report

The Parish Council receives the Rural Policing Report on a quarterly basis and residents are asked to note that this is published on the Council website under the News section. The Rural Policing Report contains useful information relating to Steeple Ashton and the wider rural area.

Defibrillator

At the April PC meeting Members considered the purchase of a second defibrillator for the village and agreed to allocate the required funding to take this forward. The Council is looking into available grant funding support and investigating appropriate locations for the installation of a second device.

The Parish Council will be approving the year end accounts for the financial year 2023-2024 at the June meeting. #### WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR NEWS FROM JONATHON SEED

I have now been a Wiltshire Councillor for 15 years and am still very much enjoying working in the local area, with all of our Parish Councils and on behalf of local residents. I am in the area most days and work closely with the excellent Parish Council on local government matters. As the Wiltshire Councillor for your area I am always happy to help residents to resolve your issues with local government matters. For Wiltshire Council this particularly means planning concerns, highways issues, waste collection matters and lots of other services provided by Wiltshire Council.

As we enter the new financial year this is a time to look forward at plans for local government doing our best for local people. We are blessed not only with living in a beautiful County but also in one of the (sadly rare) Council areas that has managed its finances well and is not in financial difficulty. This does not mean that we can afford to do all that we want to do but it does mean that we can do our best to produce decent local services. This includes an improving leisure service, a decent library service, regular and reliable waste services, and care for the vulnerable. That having been said, our roads are not good but are receiving better investment this spring than in most local government areas.

Over the past year I have increased my work within Wiltshire Council and I am now a member of the influential Overview and Scrutiny Management Committee as well as the Strategic Planning Committee, the Western Area Planning Committee and I also chair the Melksham Area Board. My work in County Hall has included chairing policy development committees on social housing allocation and speed limit assessment. All of this Council work has been made more difficult since mid March when I suffered a fractured pelvis in a riding accident but I am now well down the road to recovery and getting out and about.

In summary there is always lots to do as a Wiltshire Councillor, which is supposed to be a part time role(!), however I will always make time to help local residents with local government issues. #### NATURAL HISTORY CLUB

It's now May and we are having reports of summer migrants arriving. Warblers such as Blackcap, ChiffChaff and Willow Warbler are here and have been for several weeks as have House Martins and Swallows. Cuckoos are also on their way back from Africa to breed here. Keep a listen out as they are around this area.

Local hibernating mammals such as Bats, hedgehogs and possibly dormice, if there are any locally, are becoming active.

If you see a wild bird or animal in distress, there are a lot of caring folk in the village who want to help our wildlife when it needs it but one of the best points of contacts for this area is the Wiltshire Wildlife Hospital. Their contact phone number is 07850 778752. They are a team of dedicated volunteers and will offer advice on pretty much any situation.

And It is worth looking here first before calling.

Recently, we had a foraging walk from High Street down to Luffenham field led by one of our members. This turned out to be a real eye opener. You would be surprised that the weeds growing down Butts lane for example, could probably sustain you and heal you in times of trouble. For instance, did you know that Hogweed can be used like asparagus and Ribwort Plantain is an excellent anti-histamine for nettle stings and insect bites.

We are a non-subscription village club and free to join so if you want to learn more about the flora and fauna around us, please come along to our next meeting where you will meet local people with knowledge in natural history.

Our next meeting will be on: Thursday 13th June at 7:30pm at the Methodist Church Hall, High Street Steeple Ashton. The short talk will be a demonstration of birdsong identification.

#### METHODIST CHURCH

In Salvador Dali's paintings you can sometimes find crutches. I've been told that these symbolise how none of us can manage in life completely on our own. We all need help and support. Maybe this is why Jesus sent his disciples out two by two. Yet loneliness is something I think most of us have experienced, more or less. In our journeys through life, we don't always walk two by two.

I remember once, when travelling on my own, I got stuck at the Airport overnight due to bad weather conditions. It was late evening. I sat down on the floor and another woman of my age did the same. We looked at each other, both tired and on our own. We started chatting. The restaurants were closed, but we went to the small supermarket to buy some food to share. With the help of a few tissues my suitcase became a dinner table, and laughter and thoughts about life turned our cheese, bread and juice into a little feast. Our life journeys crossed, but we never spoke again.

Could it be that God sends strangers our way sometimes, as supporting crutches? Two by two. Maybe the one next to us isn't someone we know very well. Maybe it's someone who just briefly crosses our path. Other times we can feel utterly alone without even a stranger to be found.

Then I think of another feast: simple bread and a drop of wine. A feast where I sense a love that, like a crutch, is there to support us, even in times of loneliness.

Can you remember a brief meeting with a stranger that meant a lot to you? Could you have been that stranger to someone else?

On Thursday 14 th March it was announced that Bishop Declan Lang has resigned as the Bishop of Clifton due to health reasons. We keep Bishop Declan in our thoughts and prayers and thank him for his 23 years as our faithful and dedicated 9 th Bishop of Clifton. Following on from this announcement, it has also been announced that Canon Bosco McDonald has been invited by Pope Francis to become the 10 th Bishop of Clifton. Which Canon Bosco has excepted. Canon Bosco is at present the Dean of Clifton Cathedral and a priest of our Diocese. We keep Bishop Elect Bosco also in our prayers at this time.

The ordination will take place on May 8th at 12 noon in Clifton Cathedral in Bristol.

#### 'Thin places'

Over Easter there was a series of TV programmes about a group of pilgrims on a journey across North Wales to the holy island of Bardsey. Some of the group were better known on TV than others; their faiths were diverse.

At one point a priest took them to the top of a hill and explained about 'thin places' where heaven and earth might be felt to be closer than usual. Examples might be mountain peaks disappearing into the mist, the horizon where sea and sky meet, or places with particular spiritual significance. The pilgrims encountered all of these on their journey.

We might perceive a spiritual 'thin place' between heaven and earth in these days after Easter. Jesus, risen from death, appears and reappears in different places. Mountains and seashores feature strongly in these accounts. Likewise, angels, figures in white robes, Jesus' ascension, and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost suggest movement between earth and heaven. We too might feel those links in our own lives are closer than usual as we hear these stories and join in seasonal worship. What these stories also make clear is that no matter where we are, and no matter what the time of year, God is always close to us whether in clear sunshine or hidden by the clouds that lie low on the hills of our lives. **Richard Havergal**



#### The Great Hinton Heritage Group

This group was formed some 6 months ago with the idea of exploring the history and natural environment of the village and its surroundings.

With very little having been written about the village we decided that the main project would be to look at the Houses of Hinton, not just the older and listed ones but every house that we could find had been erected in the village. We were soon to find that this included several which had been demolished or destroyed during the last century. Fortunately we have managed to discover photographic evidence of all these properties. Dating property, has proved much more tricky and often we are dependent on the listed building status as the historical evidence is scant. The hope eventually is to develop a chronology or timeline of the villages development. In this we are being aided by the Long Estate Map of 1760, the Tithe Maps of the 1800's, and the 1911 property sale, of houses owned by the Longs in the village.

Fortunately one of our members has unearthed all the Census data for the village which will prove hugely useful when matching up people to houses. However if you have information which could help us discover more please get in touch.

At our monthly meetings we have heard interesting talks from members of our group on many issues, including one on the Castle Leaze complex, and another on the Peppercorn Orchard estate, which we discovered was originally going to be called the Elms.

Recently a member gave a talk on the Warship Week (February 1942) fund raising event which saw the village raise money to sponsor H.M.S. Aphis. Another ongoing venture is what we call Covid Times. It was thought it might be a good idea before memories fade to ask villagers to put down their reminiscences of that period that so altered our lives, and this has met with a good response with several informative and interesting replies which have highlighted many of the issues that affected us all, and some which where unique to that individual.

#### Bryan & David Berrett write...

The Victorian Gothic mansion of Rood Ashton House was constructed in 1808, and then remodelled during the 1830s by architect Thomas Hopper. It had been built to replace a smaller, earlier house that had been bought in 1597 by Edward Long of Monkton, from William Button. When its demolition began in May 1975 after a decision by then-owner Mr A J Green of Trowbridge, this former grand home to the Long family had been in a stripped and ruinous condition for more than 20 years.

In 1930, when the Longs sold their estate following the death of Walter Hume Long – 1st Viscount Long of Wraxall – six years earlier, the house sale catalogue described the central hall as giving access to "the Magnificent Suite of Six Reception Rooms". On the first floor, separate from the "Servants' Wing", the catalogue gives details of "Eleven Principal Bed and Dressing Rooms". The second floor contained seven bedrooms, and the servants' quarters 12. A "Nursery Wing" is detailed, which contained "School Room, Governess' Bed Room, Night Nursery, Bed Room, Box Room and Nursemaid's Pantry, and above on the Second Floor are Housemaid's cupboard, Wardrobe Room, Work Room and two Maids' Rooms." Further rooms are also described, including "Six Men's Rooms and Two Chauffeurs' Rooms over the Laundries and Carpenter's Shop."

#### Rood Ashton House, mid-19th century



In July 1984, a student at Bristol University named Richard Murphy wrote a dissertation on Walter Hume Long and his association with the Conservative Party. Submitted towards his Doctor of Philosophy degree, Murphy titled this dissertation: 'Walter Long and the Conservative Party, 1905-1921'.

On pages six and seven of his work, Murphy introduces Rood Ashton House and its grounds, and quotes a description from a 22 December 1886 piece named 'Celebrities at Home' – a feature which ran in 'The World', a weekly society paper published in London from 1874 until 1920. Murphy begins:

Today, the main road between Westbury and Melksham passes directly in front of Road Ashton and the house lies in ruins. But an impression of the estate as it was in Long's lifetime can be gleaned from a description published in 1886:

You have barely left the tall chimneys and quaint brick houses of Trowbridge behind you, when you enter by an avenue of Scotch firs an expanse of tree-studded meadows which form the favourite grazing ground of the Rood Ashton shorthorns. From the Castle Lodge the road through the home-park rises abruptly till you come suddenly on a carefully kept garden, and a house ... of Tudoresque turrets, pinnacles and battlements .... On one side is an Italian fountain, standing amidst ... trim flowerbeds ...; at the foot of the grassy slope, with its giant elms and beeches, lies a dark willow-fringed lake, tenanted by swans and wild ducks; on the other side rises steep Stourton Hill, with its covers and its famous fox-earth; while in the valley beyond, the distant woods, copses and hedgerows of Gastard seem to fade away into gray mist. ... Passing the billiard room with its Japanese cabinets ... leads you into a central lobby, which takes in the whole height of the house. The Gothic tracery, the vaulted roof, and the elaborate stucco mouldings, all savour of the present, ... and a green baize door ... opens on the ... roomy and cheerful study.'

Here, then, was the centre of Long's world, his home and his retreat throughout a political career spanning four decades.
