# GREAT HINTON AUGUST/SEPTEMBER 2024



One hundred years ago, this triptych oil painting by A B Connor (1880-1960) was completed for St Mary's Church, and mounted in the late-Victorian reredos behind the altar. It remained there until the late 1960s — when unknown and unwelcome visitors vandalised the images with a lit candle. Considered damaged beyond repair, all three were removed and never replaced. With the organ pipes now restored to their former glory, we can imagine the visual impact this east end once exhibited. When sunlit by the stained-glass east window (replaced with opaque in 1978), the area beyond the chancel step was a blaze of colour. **Bryan Berrett**.

#### STEEPLE ASHTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

#### **Luffenham Meadow**

At the July PC meeting Members considered the future arrangements for Luffenham Meadow and it was formally resolved that the Council would take on the lease for an initial period of one year, subject to the approval of the lease documents.

#### **Events on Council owned land**

The Parish Council has recently received a request to use council owned land for a local event. The insurance arrangements for granting permission to such requests have now been established with the PC's insurer. Any local group wishing to use Council owned land for an event is asked to complete an event form and send this, together with an appropriate risk assessment, to the Parish Clerk. It would be extremely helpful if this could be done at least a month prior to the planned event (where possible) so that the appropriate submission to the insurers can be made in good time. Forms can be obtained from the Parish Clerk.

#### WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR NEWS FROM JONATHON SEED

This is a pretty busy summer for me as your local government representative and made even more busy by the calling of the General Election. That is now over and we have a new MP to whom we wish the very best of luck during his tenure.

As your Wiltshire Councillor for Melksham Without West and Rural I attend as many of the Parish Councils as I can in the villages of Berryfield, Semington, Great Hinton, Keevil, Steeple Ashton and Broughton Gifford. I also attend other local events such as fetes, coffee mornings and Annual Parish Meetings. Part of my role is to represent you at County Hall where I sit on both the Strategic and Western Area Planning Committee as well as the influential Overview and Scrutiny Task Group where I also chair policy forming Task Groups. I have been elected to Chair the Melksham Area Board for a further year. In addition I sit on my own local village Parish Council and run a small business. I have recently chaired an all party Task Group to look into the process of speed limit assessments in the County and after many month of meetings and taking evidence we have made recommendations that we hope will improve the process and its transparency as well as providing an appeals process where applicants and sports, gardening and supporting my daughter as an international equestrian athlete. I also give time as a volunteer to oversee the running of nationally organised Horse Trials so I have plenty to do all year round.

Over the past weeks there has been a great deal going on in this Wiltshire Council Division of Melksham Without West and Rural. Every village has some important project that they are working on and many of these use a little help from Wiltshire Council. My role is to facilitate that help. This ranges form significant Highways contributions to installation of curbing on the grass verge on the Hight Street in Keevil, to the installation of an Automatic Number Plate Recognition Camera at the Semington Bus Gate to working to limit unacceptable traffic through Great Hinton. I also help our local communities to improve their quality of life and this ranges from supporting Area Board grant applications for projects such as Great Hinton Historical matters to negotiating local matters between villages and one of these was to help get the redundant Steeple Ashton goal posts transferred to the thriving football club in Semington. I also visit community groups who have been supported by Grants for our Area Board

to see how our community funding is being used and last month I visited the local Riding for the Disabled Group to see just how well they use grant funding. It is all part of what I do!

I was concerned to see the wild flower verge in Steeple Ashton mowed in early July so I wrote to the Area Highways Manager on behalf of Steeple Ashton residents and particularly those who put so much work into that verge. I received a refreshingly honest and helpful response in which the Highways Department admitted that the young operative of the mower misread his map and mowed the verge in error. They also offered an extra day of work from the Highways Department in the village and the Parish Council is currently negotiating this. Not an ideal situation but at least Wiltshire Council is trying to put a genuine mistake right.

I have been out and about delivering leaflets in all villages this year, including Steeple Ashton. I really enjoy getting out in your village as it gives me a great opportunity to talk to you and other residents. Similarly attending village events affords good social opportunity.

#### NATURAL HISTORY CLUB

Last month we seemed to experience every season within a week or two. Cold days, hot days, rainy days, humid days and gusty wind days. I guess that's what our weather is going to be like now.

There was a lot of bird and wildlife sightings reported from gardens last month such as;

A Sparrowhawk perched on a greenhouse with a wood pigeon sat nearby totally unfazed. Also a Great Spotted woodpecker feeding a newly fledged juvenile. The ever increasing numbers of Red Kite's in the area are forcing them to look for food in gardens. They rarely kill other animals but are capable of killing small mammals such as mice, voles and rabbits. Being quite lazy they prefer dead meat or carrion. Even a Peahen has been making the rounds in village gardens. Most likely an escapee from another local garden.

As well as birds, caterpillars are being reported especially moths. Poplar Hawkmoth and Cinnabar Moth in particular. A White Admiral Butterfly was seen in Biss Wood. They are widespread in Southern England but not particularly common. Look for them on Bramble.

The young Peregrines are still checking out the church tower as a potential nesting site. Maybe one day?

Quite a few young Hedgehogs, or hoglets as they are known, have had to be rescued mainly from themselves as they wander out onto the roads. A local resident has been checking them, feeding them, weighing and releasing them back into a safer area. Being born this time of the year should enable them to fatten up enough to survive winter hibernation.

Our next meeting is on Thursday 3rd October at 7:30pm at the Methodist Church Hall, High Street, Steeple Ashton. All are welcome. The short talk is yet to be determined.



# Chest tombs in the churchyard, St Mary's, Steeple Ashton

A list of chest tombs in the churchyard which are in need of repair and conservation is now also available in the church porch. The PCC is applying for a Faculty for permission to carry out this work.

This request is for anyone responsible for the maintenance of a tomb (heir-at-law) to notify us that it should remain as it is, or to offer to fund its refurbishment.

Please also note that any repair or refixing of a tomb may only take place after prior consultation with the PCC.

The following chest tombs are in urgent need of repair and restoration and some have been barriered off for safety reasons.

There are six chest tombs as follows:

Grade II\* List entry - 1252398 (A1 and A2 on map)

2 tombs, both early to mid 18cen, the southern one collapsed, in very poor condition and barriered off for safety.

Grade II List entry - 1262301 (B1 and B2 on map)

2 chest tombs in poor condition. This entry includes the Ball family tomb, late 18cen and the Mitchell family tomb also late 18cen.

Grade II List entry – 1252397 (C1 and C2 on map)

2 chest tombs in poor condition, late 18cen.

There is a map identifying the position of these chest tombs posted in the church porch.


